Beautiful Pictures by Brian James Spies

Factory Works presents an exhibition of large format photographs by Williamsport photographer, Brian James Spies. The two bodies of work that make up this exhibition seek to foreground beauty as the supreme endeavor, both creative and human, of our time. According to Spies, "Beauty is what makes life worth living and my decision to make these pictures is a concerted effort to remind myself and others of this fact." This first body of work, "Unicorns," consists of portraits of various creatives from in and around Williamsport that have been printed using the silver halide process in the darkroom and then hand dyed using a process developed by Spies. The second body of work consists of the artist's ongoing explorations of gender identity. These works, consisting of Silver Gelatin and Chromogenic Prints, known as the "Hinterland Drag Performance", are self-portraits done in character as what Spies refers to as The Pennsylvania Dutchess. Join us First Friday, 6pm-9pm, for the opening reception. Light refreshments will be served.
